

THE BOROUGH OF READING

(CIVIL ENFORCEMENT AREA)

(WAITING / ONE WAY / CYCLE LANE RESTRICTIONS) (SIDMOUTH STREET) ORDER 202*

The Reading Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 4(2), 32, 33, 35, 39, 45 and 46 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act of 1984”), as amended and of all other powers thereunto enabling and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 and Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 (“the Act of 2004”), hereby make the following Order:-

PART I **CITATION AND INTERPRETATION**

1. This Order may be cited as The Borough of Reading (Civil Enforcement Area) (Waiting /One Way / Cycle Lane Restrictions) (Sidmouth Street) Order 202* and shall come into operation on ***.
2. In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:-
 - “ambulance” has the same meaning as in the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994;
 - “authorised parking place” means any parking place on a road, authorised or designated by this Order;
 - “Bicycle” means a pedal cycle with 2 wheels, and includes a trailer drawn thereby
 - “civil enforcement officer” has the same meaning as in section 76 of the Act of 2004;
 - “Cycle Lane” a division of the carriageway marked by paint (TSRGD 2016) “cycle lane” part of a carriageway of a road reserved for pedal cycles which is separated from the rest of the carriageway—(a)if it may not be used by vehicles other than pedal cycles, by the marking provided for at item 7 of the sign table in Part 6 of Schedule 9;(b)if it may be used by vehicles other than pedal cycles when clear of pedal cycles, by the marking provided for at item 2 or 3 of the sign table in Part 4 of Schedule 11
 - “disabled person's badge”, “disabled person’s vehicle” and “parking disc” have the same meanings as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
 - “goods” means goods or burden of any description and includes postal packets of any description;
 - “hackney carriage” means a vehicle licensed under Section 37 of the Town Police Causes Act 1847, Section 6 of the Metropolitan Carriages Act 1869, or any similar enactment;
 - “loading” means the loading or unloading of goods to or from a vehicle;
 - “pedal cycle” means a unicycle, bicycle, tricycle or cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle that is not treated as a motor vehicle for the purposes of the 1984 Act;

“relevant position” means a disabled person’s badge, displayed in accordance with Section 12 of The disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

3. The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any Regulations or Orders made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.
4. Save where the contrary is indicated, any reference in this Order to:-
 - (a) a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order;
 - (b) this Order or another Order shall be construed as such a reference to this Order or, as the case may be, such other Order, as the same may have been or may from time to time be amended, varied or supplemented;
 - (c) a Statute or Regulation shall be construed as reference to such Statute or Regulations as the same may have been, or may from time to time be amended or re-enacted.
 - (d) The requirements of any Article making reference to a numbered Schedule to this Order shall only have effect when a Schedule similarly numbered is appended to this Order.

PART II

WAITING AND LOADING OF VEHICLES

5. Save as provided in Articles 6 and 7 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any vehicle during each separately dated day to wait at any time on Mondays to Sundays inclusive in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3;
6. Nothing in Article 5 shall apply to any vehicle waiting in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as it may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads;
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to the said lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system;
 - (v) the service of a Local Authority or a Water Authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (c) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of providing a postal service as defined in section 27 Postal Services Act 2011;

- (d) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads;
- (e) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads for so long as such waiting by that vehicle is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral;
- (f) the vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

7. (1) Nothing in Article 5 shall apply:-

- (a) to any vehicle waiting for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle;
- (b) to a Disabled Person's Vehicle, displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in accordance with Section 12 of The Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;
- (c) to a Disabled Person's Vehicle, displaying a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position, waiting on the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2, during the specified limited waiting hours;

provided that such exemptions do not apply during the hours when loading restrictions are imposed by that Article.

(2) Nothing in Article 5 shall apply to any vehicle:-

- (a) waiting upon an authorised parking place; or
- (b) being a Hackney Carriage, waiting upon an authorised cab rank; or
- (c) waiting for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used in the provision of a local service within the meaning of the Transport Act 1985.

PART III ONE WAY RESTRICTION

8. Save as provided in Article 9 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 to proceed in a direction other than that specified opposite to it in Column 2 of said Schedule, provided that it shall not be in contravention of this restriction for a person who wishes to enter property or use any authorised parking place in the road to manoeuvre into and out of that place by means of forward and reverse gears.

9. Nothing in Article 8 shall apply to:

- a) any person acting on the direction of a police officer or a Civil Enforcement Officer, or;
- b) as it may be necessary to enable a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

PART IV CYCLE LANE

10. Save as provided by Article 11 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle, not being a Bicycle or a Pedal Cycle to proceed at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 11

11 Nothing in Article 10 shall apply: (1) for so long as may be necessary to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with any of the following if it cannot reasonably be used for such purpose without waiting in the road and the vehicle is so parked for no longer than is necessary to enable the vehicle to be so used: a) by a person acting on the direction of a police officer or a Civil Enforcement Officer, or; b) as it may be necessary to enable a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.
